Report - September 2012

The Cricket Supporters Group has resolved to recover 2 practice nets in the current facility to provide a synthetic grass surface option for team practice. Tim Hughes will be consulted.

Regarding St Pauls BNJHA half season teams:

- 13 new boys have started with St Paul's half season teams for 2012 shirts and caps will be provided to the new players
- 2012 teams include:
 - o U8 7 players
 - o U9 9 players
 - o U10 10 players
 - o Under 12 12 players
 - o Under 14 15 players
- Specialist coaching provided by the CSG has been organized for the U14 team at Premier Cricket, at a reduced rate. The Under 12 team will receive the same assistance, but is still to be organized at a suitable date and time.
- Nominations have been called for U14 representative selections and Anstey LaFranz competition, and U13 trials.
- All interested coaches, current and former cricketers were welcomed to nominate for selection duties
- In accordance with the school's request the BNHJA was advised that St Paul's grounds will only be made available for games being played by St Paul's teams – this was fully supported by the CSG.
- Regarding next year's sign-on organization the CSG has resolved to ensure sign on messages in the daily notices be done 4-5 days prior to sign-on and that a message be read out at assembly.

Regarding TAS Cricket, it was resolved that the CSG should look into preenrolment information be given to future St Paul's families at Yr6 interviews. This would alert parents early enough to enable considering their child's involvement in SPS TAS cricket. The current situation makes it more likely that their child will be locked into a club team when the first trimester sports for TAS are on.

- \$637.34 for target stumps for teams
- \$945.40 for balls and scorebooks
- \$950.00 for BNJHA half season fees
