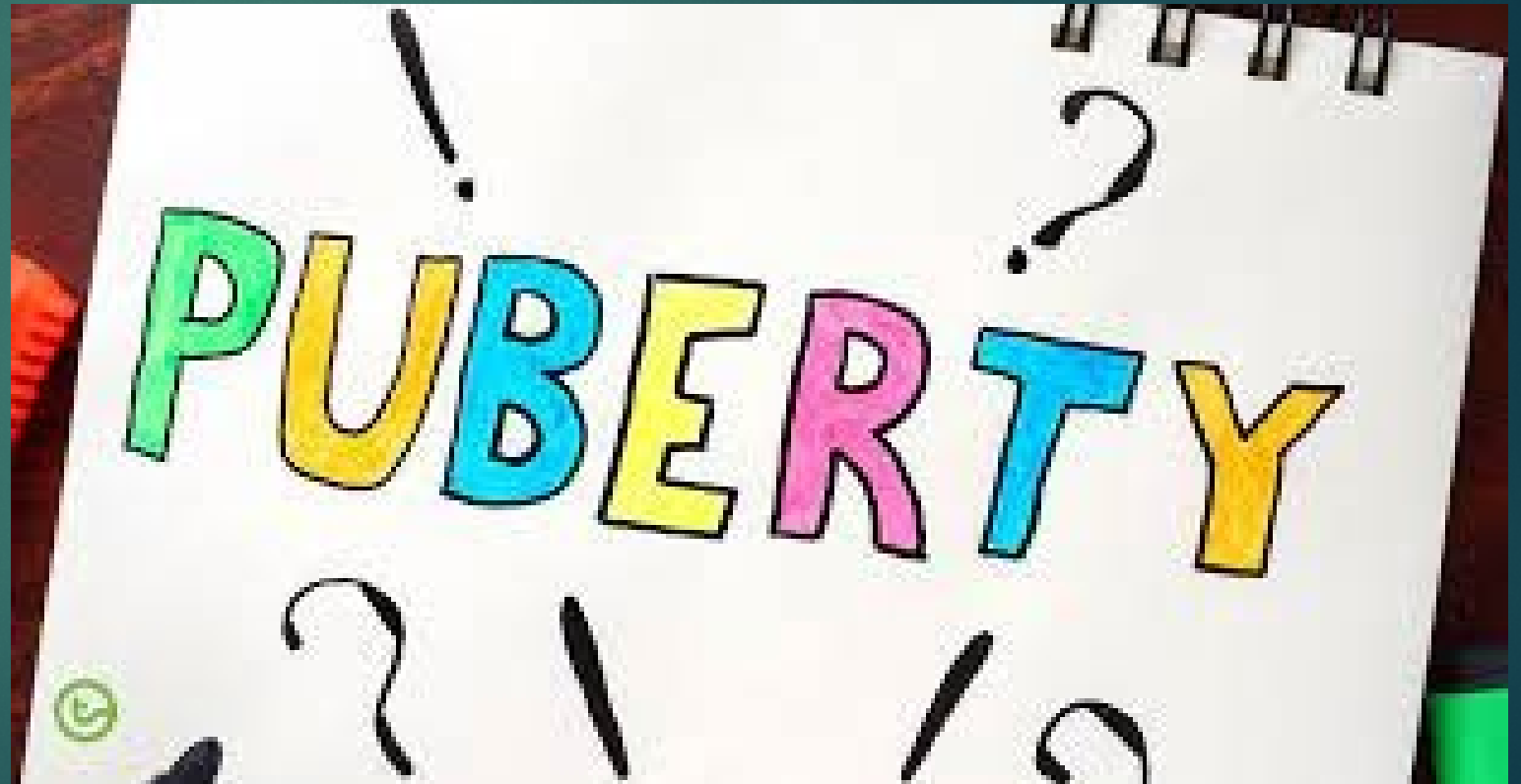
Setting an example
